 Information as of 7 p.m. Monday

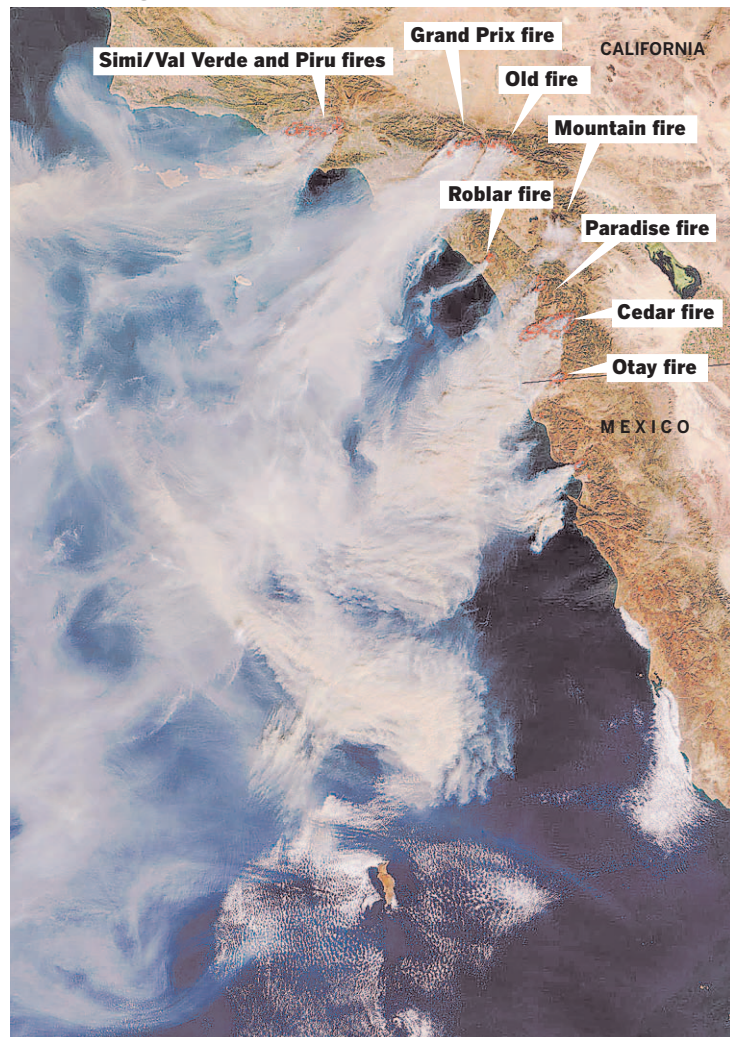

Santa Ana winds subsided as fires pushed into northeastern Los Angeles County on Monday. The death toll continued to rise in San Diego County and more homes were lost as the fire crossed Interstate 8.

Satellite image of the fires



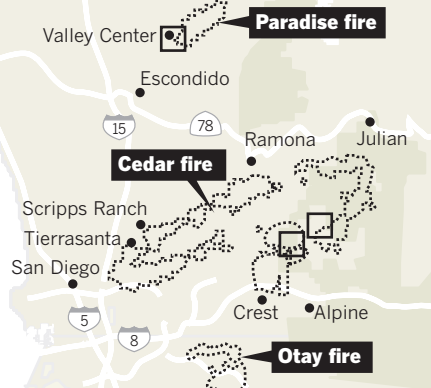
